Directors Note

How do we describe a play such as Sanctuary City?

Literally speaking, it is a 90-minute play separated into two sections. The first section is told through vignettes of abstract memories interspersed between multiple main events of B and G's last years in high school. The second section shifts in stark contrast, rooting itself in a continuous scene of a realistic time and place-B's apartment during a late hour of the night, years after the end of high school, a few days before the New Year.

Emotionally speaking, the play begins with a character seeking refuge in another character's space. Soon they discover and develop a deep sanctuary within one another. This is a play about love and survival. It is about the significance of revealing intimate truths to ourselves and to those we trust because the truth sets us free. It is about creating a home for yourself with the help of someone else- a home that may house heartbreaking lessons of betrayal. Regardless, it is essential to still let love in.

Historically speaking, 9/11 left a lingering tragedy for the victims as well as the immigrants made out to be villains in the aftermath of immense grief turning into hate. Considering this historical backdrop, it is vital to recognize the good qualities of communication, compassion, transparency, and advocacy severely lacking in the characters' inner lives and within the whole of American society at this point in time.

Sanctuary City is an excruciatingly human play showcasing our universal need for connection and a brave space for us to live out our dreams as safely as we can. Sadly, that is not easily accessible to everyone. As immigrants, these characters are doing their best to create the lives they desire in order to live their best American dream. My sincere intention is to deliver a play that hurts as it heals. Brace yourself for the loving impact. The only way out is through.
